Introduction

Welcome to the Children's MARS Board Training Programme 2018/19.

The programme is built around the common professional standards that professionals working with children and young people must demonstrate:

- Children / young people at the centre of what we do
- Respect for individuals, promoting their dignity and individuality
- That the well-being and safeguarding of individuals is promoted
- A value base that is built around recognising the rights of individuals
- Honesty and integrity in their interactions with others
- High standards in the of quality of service, care and support for individuals, data protection, information sharing and record keeping
- An awareness and understanding of responsibilities to assess and manage risk
- Accountability for actions and decisions
- Keeping up to date with knowledge and skills

Expectations in relation to continuing professional development

North Lincolnshire's Children's MARS Board seeks to support individuals in keeping up to date with their knowledge and skills and also in the acquisition of further skills and expertise through the provision of training and in supporting development opportunities. The training provided by the Children's MARS Board supports practitioners in maintaining and developing their core skills for working and engaging with children, young people and their families.

As part of the development opportunities provided by the Board it runs information sessions, practice forums, locality days and conferences; which promote putting theory into practice, developing expertise and will enhance confidence in protecting children and young people. Publications that support learning and that may be of interest are highlighted in the awareness level training section.

There will be an expectation for employers to ensure staff complete the 8 week feedback survey sent to all attendees of Children's MARS Board courses in relation to the effectiveness of training in relation to practice.

Roles and responsibilities in relation to safeguarding training

Working Together 2018 sets out the specific roles and responsibilities agencies have in relation to safeguarding training. There are other documents such as *Safeguarding Children and Young People: roles and competences for health care staff intercollegiate document September 2010*, which set out the specific requirements for individual agencies and the standards by which they will be inspected against.

Employers

Employers are responsible for ensuring that their staff are competent and confident in carrying out their responsibilities for safeguarding and promoting children's and young people's welfare.

It is the responsibility of employers to recognise that in order for staff to fulfil their duties in line with Working Together, they will have different training needs which are dependent on their degree of contact with children and young people and/or with adults who are parents or carers, their level of responsibility and independence of decision-making.

Employers should ensure that their employees who work or have contact with children are appropriately trained in child development and in how to recognise and act on potential signs of child abuse and neglect. Training should also include associated vulnerability risk factors, resilience and protective factors, identifying potential violent behaviour and assessing the capacity of a parent or carer to meet a child's needs, taking into account their own needs, circumstances, history, also any illness or addiction. Increasingly, professional bodies are requiring their members to demonstrate relevant education and training as part of revalidation.

Employers should ensure that appropriately qualified staff undertaking specialist roles in both children's and adults' services receive the necessary specialist training. For those experienced social workers undertaking key management and supervisory roles this should include, where relevant, training on managing referrals where there are concerns about the safety and welfare of a child or children.

Employers also have a responsibility to identify adequate resources and support for multi-agency training by:

- committing resources for multi-agency training, for example through funding, providing venues, providing staff who contribute to the planning, delivery and/or evaluation of multi-agency training
- providing staff who have the relevant expertise to support the Children's MARS Board (for example, by actively contributing to Children's MARS Board training)

- releasing staff to attend the appropriate multi-agency training courses and ensuring availability for them to complete multi-agency training tasks and apply their learning in practice
- encouraging and supporting their staff to complete post course evaluation forms
- ensuring that staff receive relevant single-agency training that enables them to maximise the learning derived from multi-agency training.

The role of the Children’s MARS Board

The Children’s MARS Board is responsible for developing local policies for safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children, in relation to the training of people who work with children or in services affecting the safety and welfare of children.

The Children’s MARS Board must have in place a learning and improvement framework and the training programme is one element of this framework.

The Children’s MARS Board should review and evaluate the quality, scope and effectiveness of single and inter-agency training to ensure it is meeting local needs.

The Children’s MARS Board aims to promote a culture of learning and continuous improvement so that professionals who are working with children, young people and their families safeguard and promote the wellbeing of children and young people.

Common Drivers for the Training Programme

The Children's MARS Board training programme is built around national drivers, research and best practice, learning from national and local reviews of cases, learning from case audit and local training needs analysis.

Aspirations of Children's MARS Board training

- To develop expert practitioners
- To equip people to identify and support children and young people at the earliest point of possible intervention
- To ensure that the experience of children and their families of services is positive because of how professionals have engaged and work with them
- To embed core values and principles of how we work with children and families across multi agencies
- To ensure a confident and competent workforce

Pricing Structure

Children's MARS Board training is designed to reflect national drivers and local procedures. It will add value to a professional's continuous professional development in the area of safeguarding and child protection. The Children's MARS Board has tried to keep charges to a minimum although some charge has to be made to cover specific training courses.

AWARENESS - Workbooks and signposting to relevant websites and resources will be available free of charge. (Note: there may be a charge for e-learning by a national body).

INTERMEDIATE- There is no charge for Children's MARS Board contributing agencies (agencies who provide a financial contribution to the Children's MARS Board budget) or voluntary and community groups for intermediate courses.

All other non-contributing organisations, agencies, groups or businesses will be charged £25 per person per half day for intermediate courses (or pro rata).

MASTERCLASSES - For masterclasses, that have a cost implication, all agencies will be charged £50 per day per person (or pro rata), unless otherwise stated.

The exception is the child protection two day masterclass which is free for contributing agencies. Non-contributing agencies will be charged as above.

Please note that failure to attend without notification within 5 days of the course will incur a £50 charge.

Please note that some of the training courses are targeted for practitioners who are involved in particular areas of work with children, young people and families and that some of the content and/or delivery methods maybe of a sensitive nature and may cause distress to individuals.

Non-attendance at training courses

Having booked onto a course, you must attend it, unless there is a very serious reason why you cannot. The following reasons are the only ones acceptable for non-attendance:

- Illness sufficient to keep you away from work
- Bereavement following the death of a close relative
- Attendance required at court, either in connection with a case, or personal (including jury duty)
- Accident or breakdown whilst travelling to the training
- Severe weather conditions that have caused general disruption
- Other serious event or situation as decided by your line manager

You will be expected to organise your leave and your routine work commitments in order to attend the training.

Managers must organise their team so that workers can attend training they are committed to. Teams should expect to provide cover for the worker absent on training, except in situations described above.
