- The GP considers a number of appropriate treatments which includes using talking therapies (Improving Access to Psychological Therapy) before using medications.
- Antidepressant medications for example can take 4 to 6 weeks to be affective. The GP may wish to increase the dose of an existing antidepressant or try another type of antidepressants.
- GP's are requested to try 3 antidepressants before referring to secondary mental health services.



# Improving Access to Psychological Therapy (IAPT)

Based at The Talking Shop, we help people aged 18 and over suffering with common mental

health problems, such as depression or anxiety, symptoms may include:

- Low Mood
- Stress
- Panic
- Sleep Disturbance
- Worry
- Phobia
- Guided self help
- Self- help material
- Treatment programmes for depression and anxiety
- Skills Classes
- Cognitive behavioural therapy



Preventative model - The Primary Care Network Mental Health Team - RDaSH. This team will offer routine mental health assessments and IAPT (Improving Access to Psychological Therapy) services for patients presenting to their GP with a mental health condition. They will provide health checks for patients with a severe mental illness and offering appointments in convenient locations for patients diagnosed with dementia, or with complex medication regimes. Would require a referral via the GP or Secondary mental health services via the single point of access.

**Referrals** to Secondary Mental Health Services can be made by -

- self-referral or
- anyone with the consent of the individual
- or in the person's best interest if the individual does not have the capacity to self-refer
- All referrals are screened & triaged.
- Assessments are usually undertaken within 2 weeks from the referral or sooner if urgent.
- For those with memory problems the GP is required to undertake dementia screening

Urgent mental health assessments are carried out in a location depending on the individual's circumstance. This can take place within their home, at Great Oaks or the A&E department [if there are any medical needs]

Following the assessment, individuals are signpost or referred to appropriate service. This could be to their GP, talking therapies, the third sector or to other RDaSH services or a
